



Industrial Vegetation Management - Applicator (40 Positions)

Term: Four-month positions, begins May 5nd.
 Location: Lloydminster, AB and Regina, SK.
 Salary: \$20.00/hr regular time, \$30.00/hr overtime.
 Hours of Work: Average of 55 hours per week.
 Meals: \$500 per month subsistence pay.
 Hotels: Provided for season with exception of long weekends.
 Safety Bonus: To be determined early 2019.

The Company:

Based out of Lloydminster AB and Regina SK, Marksmen Vegetation Management Inc. provides industrial locations with vegetation control. We are a growing, expanding company providing over 28 years of service to our clientele. At Marksmen we are dedicated to providing high quality customer service.

Job Description/Responsibilities:

Industrial applicators our front line workers in the battle against invasive alien species and problematic weeds. We manage right-of-ways, oil and gas, transportation corridors and mines across western Canada. The position starts with in-depth training on health and safety, herbicides, and Industrial Vegetation Management best practices. Crews are split up and we hit the road for the summer spending 10 - 30 days in each community while we spray various industrial sites.

We start early in the morning (4:00 a.m. - 5:30 a.m.) and we work until we get our 12 hour day. Spraying is optimal in the morning so there's always a push to get out early. Our trucks are registered as commercial vehicles so we are capped at 12h/day. Because we are weather dependent in this position you may work 3 weeks straight before a reset/rest day which happens when it's raining or too windy to work.

Average weekly hours are between 50 - 55 but you'll have some weeks much higher and others lower. In summary the position is:

- An outdoor field position
- We operate spraying equipment, small engines, UTVs and commercial trucks.
- We use GIS/GPS data to perform primarily weed spraying services but also may be required to do weed whipping, trimming or safety watch.
- We have a strong focus on safety in this industry and we require all employees to comply with a comprehensive program which includes daily meetings, environmental record keeping, and much more.
- Pre-Employment drug and alcohol screening will be performed and passing is a condition of employment.

Qualifications:

Post-Secondary students from all disciplines are encouraged to apply. Successful candidates must be willing to travel periodically and work extended hours when necessary. The ability to demonstrate road experience with a one ton truck and 4x4 ATV is considered an asset.

All employees will be required to have the following safety tickets prior to starting work, AlbertaWorks/Saskatchewan TEA may provide funding.

There will be 5 days of paid training beginning May 5, 2018 at Lakeland College in Lloydminster.
